The new pit area will be very muddy until the grass grows in. There isn't any need for club field day to assist with placing the flight stations and put the finishing touches on the new flight area.

Dick Hultz gave the safety officer's. All club members with gas engines are required to bring a fire extinguisher and all club members are encouraged to bring a first aid kit.

Keith Storrs gave the event director's report. Cub day is taking place May 7th. Keith will be catering the affair. Meal tickets will be distributed to all club members. White castle type hamburgers will be served along with chips and soda.

Gary Allen is still missing a small propane grill from the old trailer. If anyone knows it's whereabouts, please contact Gary.

Old business

We'll try to get a few tables moved to the flight area and find out when the fence and frequency board will be moved.

New Business

We have to address the club items currently being stored in the pole barn. The owner is hinting that we would like the items moved. We need to either find a club member willing to store the items or have a silent auction. One suggestion is to publish a list of the items in the newsletter. We can auction off whatever we can't get someone to store. The storage area required is roughly 10 X 5 feet.
