Minutes for LCRCC Meeting March 6, 2008

These were somewhat popular at our 9th Street field.

Old Business

Dick Hultz is still looking for cooks for the monthly summer events. If food is desired, someone would have to prepare it. The charcoal, lighter, and utensils are all in the garage. So far, Sam Brown, Chuck Brzezicki, and Dick Hultz had volunteered. After some discussion, Ray Zinkowski, Keith Storrs, and Ed Barnas also volunteered. Bill Lewis announced that he has the soda.

New Business

Dick Hultz, Steve Yeaton, and Ray Nowak met with Tom Morgenson of the Forest Preserve District. Tom said there would be no problem with pouring an apron in front of the garage. The dirt has settled somewhat, and there is fear of ruining the edge of the garage floor with the roller. Tom also said he thinks they might be able to pour a pad for a Porta-Potty either on the south side or the west side of the garage. We think the south side might be better. There is a possibility of them concreting the spectator area. There will be no shelter this year but we need to keep the request in front of them and, who knows? It may come to pass.

Tom mentioned they are very happy with what we are doing at the field. There have been no complaints.

Sunday, March 9th starts Daylight Saving Time, and we should be able to restart Tues. Fright Night possibly towards the end of April.

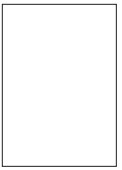
As the plane landed and was coming to a stop at Ronald Reagan, a lone voice came over the loudspeaker: "Whoa, big fella, WHOA!"
